# The History




- Native American people had been living on the land that became known as the Midwest for many years before Europeans arrived.
- French explorers arrived to set up fur trading posts.
- Spanish explorers searched the land for gold and other riches.
- Eventually the native people living there were pushed out by the westward expansion of the settlers.

- The Midwest has three types of physical geography.
  - Flat plains
  - Rolling hills
  - Mountains (a small percent)
- IIII Farming is a major part of land usage in the Midwest.
  - In the "Great Plains" states, on the west side of this region, many types of wheat are grown.
  - In the states located around the Great Lakes, many different kinds of crops can be gown in the soil.








#### Major industries include:



### Natural Resources



- Matural resources are materials that are found in the environment.
- Matural resources found in the Midwest include:
  - Coal mined from the ground
  - Oil pumped from the ground
  - Gold (In the Black Hills Mountains)
  - Forests (that provide timber )
  - Wind (turbines create energy)



### Climate



- The climate in the Midwest has four distinct weather seasons.
  - Winter is cold with lots of snow.
  - **Spring** brings rain.
  - Summer is warm and humid.
  - Fall (autumn) cools down with changing colors on leaves.
- Many of the states in the Midwest are part of "Tornado Alley".
